



Your route through the vaccination center



WELCOME!

Today you, can get vaccinated against corona.
How does it work?

► Step 1: reception

You need to go to **the reception area**.
Have these documents ready:

- your ID card or eID card
- the letter about the vaccination
- your vaccination card: if you have already received a first vaccine against corona

► Step 2: conversation

First, fill in the questions on the back. Then, you can talk to a nurse about your health.

Are you healthy enough? Are you getting your vaccine today? This is decided by the nurse.

- Today you **will** get your vaccine? You will receive a card afterwards. Do not lose it.
- You get **will not** get vaccinated today? The nurse will explain what you need to do.

► Step 3: Vaccine

You get your vaccine.

► Step 4: Wait for 15 minutes

Go to the **resting area**. Wait here for 15 minutes. Do you have an allergic reaction to the vaccine? Then we can help you right away.

After 15 minutes you can go home.

► Note!

- There are various types of vaccines. Some vaccines require you to get vaccinated twice. This is important. After the second time, you will be better protected.
- You may develop **minor symptoms** for a few days after being vaccinated.
Do you have pain, red skin, swelling on the arm?
Do you have swollen glands in your neck, armpits ...?
Do you have headaches, muscle aches, fever, pain in your joints (knees, fingers ...)? Are you tired or are you feeling nauseous?

This is **common**. After a few days, the symptoms will disappear. You can take paracetamol.

- What if you get an **allergic reaction** at home? What if you get a red rash all over your body? Then contact your general practitioner.

What if you continue to suffer from complaints or start to develop other complaints? Then contact your **general practitioner**.

Continue to follow the rules against corona

You can still pass the virus on to others.



Wear a face mask where appropriate.



Disinfect your hands.



Keep 1.5 meter distance from others.

Questions about your health

Read the questions carefully. Put a cross to indicate “yes” or “no”.

Answer honestly. This is important for your own health.

What if you do not understand a question? The nurse will help you soon.

1. Have you had a corona vaccine yet? • Yes? Answer the following question: What manufacturer and how long ago was it? Check your vaccination card. 	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? We will check to make sure you get the vaccine correctly.
2. Are you feeling sick today ? (fever, sore throat, cough, difficulty breathing, loss of smell, etc.)	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? You will not be vaccinated today. Are you cured? Only then make a new appointment.
3. Did you have any complaints (symptoms) as a result of corona in the past 14 days <u>and</u> did you have a positive corona test?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? You will not be vaccinated today. You can get vaccinated if you have no corona symptoms for 14 days.
4. Did you get a corona test in the past 14 days <u>and</u> did you have corona <u>without any complaints</u> (symptoms) according to that test?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? You will not be vaccinated today. You can get vaccinated 14 days after your test.
5. Should you be in quarantine now? For example: because you had contact with someone who has corona.	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? You can only get vaccinated 14 days after you had contact with someone who has corona.
6. Did you get a vaccine in the past 14 days? • Yes? Answer next question: How long ago? 	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? The doctor will ask you a few extra questions.
7. Are you allergic to PEG (polyethylene glycol) or polysorbate?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	There's no need to worry if you don't know.

8. Have you ever had a very allergic reaction to a drug or vaccine?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? The doctor will ask you a few extra questions.
9. Have you ever gone into anaphylactic shock (= severe life-threatening allergic reaction)?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? The doctor will ask you a few extra questions.

10. Have you ever had quincke's edema (= swelling in the throat, tongue)?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? The doctor will ask you a few extra questions.
11. Do you have systemic mastocytosis or hereditary angioedema?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	There's no need to worry if you don't know. Yes? The doctor will ask you a few extra questions.
12. Women: Are you pregnant?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? We'll make sure you get the right type of vaccine. Unless you've already received a first dose of the corona vaccine, then you will get the same vaccine.
13. Do you have asthma? And is it severe, despite the medication you take?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? You may have an allergic reaction, but the chances are small. Stay in the resting area for 30 minutes after your vaccine. Then we can help if you have a reaction to the vaccine.
14. Do you have epilepsy, or have you ever had it?	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? Don't worry, you can still get vaccinated. The vaccine may give you a fever. You can take paracetamol if the fever gives you seizures.
15. Have the glands in your armpit been removed? For example: because you had breast cancer. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes? On which side? 	Yes <input type="checkbox"/>	No <input type="checkbox"/>	Yes? We will make sure you get your vaccine properly.
16. Are you taking medication to thin your blood? For example: Asaflow, Ascal, Aspegic, Aspirine, Cardioaspirine, Clopidogrel, Clexane, Fraxiparine, Fragmin, Heparine, Plavix, Sintrom, Marcoumar, Marevan, Pradaxa, Eliquis, Lixiana, Xarelto, ...
